

# CAREER AND ADULT EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEES

One of the important tasks of the College is to provide relevant career education programs to meet the occupational needs of individuals and the trained manpower needs of business and industry. Experience has shown us that this can best be accomplished with the help of locally oriented Advisory Committees. They provide the College with advice and assistance in developing career education programs that are attuned to the times and designed to serve the needs of the area.

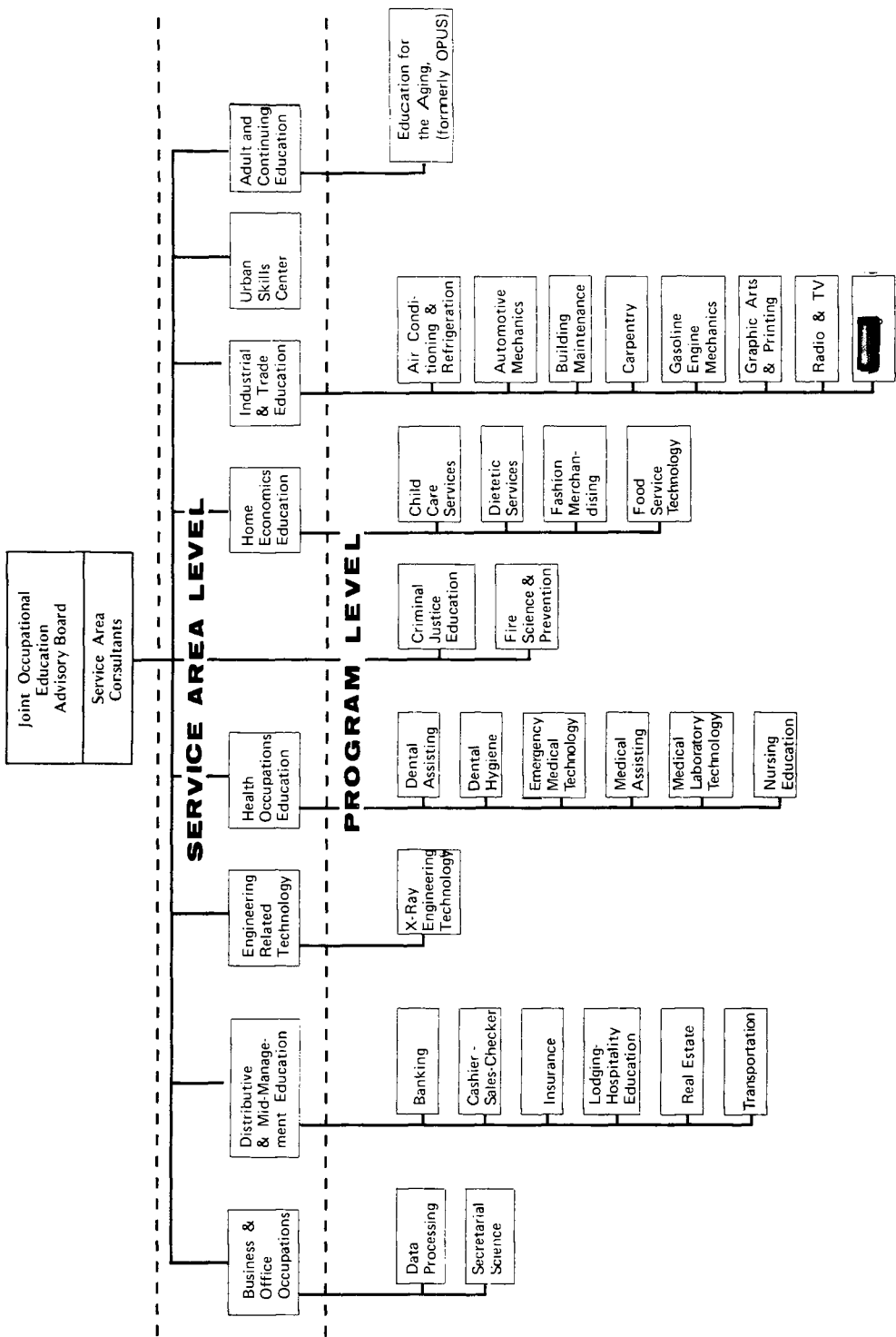
The Advisory Committee structure at Florida Junior College at Jacksonville consists of groups of persons from the community appointed to advise the College faculty regarding career (vocational-technical-occupational) and adult education programs. Advisory Committee members serve voluntarily without pay. The committees are advisory and do not possess formal authority.

The Advisory Committee structure consists of three levels. At the top level, the Joint Occupational Advisory Board consists of a select group of citizens representing a broad range of interests in the community. The function of this Board is to advise the President, Vice President for Campus Operations, and District Dean of Career and Adult-Continuing Education on the overall career and adult education programs. At the second level, service area Advisory Committees consist of citizens representing various interests and skills within the service area. The chairpersons of service area committees meet with and serve as consultants to the Joint Occupational Advisory Board. At the third level, program Advisory Committees are organized when and as required. Chairpersons of program Advisory Committees also serve as members of the appropriate service area Advisory Committee. Following this introduction is a chart which shows the advisory committee structure for the College.

The Florida Junior College at Jacksonville is very grateful for the valuable and indispensable assistance provided by our Advisory Committees in the development of career (vocational-technical-occupational) and adult education programs. Without their assistance, the rapid growth and expansion of our career and adult education programs would not have been possible.
