Historic Season for FSCJ Men's Basketball Congratulations to FSCJ Men's Basketball for their historic season! After winning the NJCAA Gulf South District Championship, the team competed in the NJCAA DII National Championship in Danville, Illinois. In the first round, they picked up an 89-75 win over #15 ranked Howard Community College, but fell just short in the second, with an 86-79 loss to the #2 seed South Suburban College.

Closing out the season with an impressive 26-10 record, they even tied the record set during the 1981-82 season. Aside from their success on the court, the team also earned an average 3.18 GPA, making them an All-Academic Team.

We celebrate their victories and successes and look forward to next season!


