



Aviation Administration (2360) | A.S. Degree

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Aviation Administration Associate in Science (A.S.) degree prepares graduates for a variety of careers in the aviation field, including airport operations, charter or corporate flight operations, aircraft dispatching, unmanned aerial systems (UAS, a.k.a. “drones”) and air traffic control (ATC).

Students may choose – via elective courses – to focus on UAS, Aircraft Dispatch or Air Traffic Control. See the College catalog or program roadmap for details. Graduates completing the Air Traffic Control specialization can qualify for hiring under the Federal Aviation Administration’s (FAA) Air Traffic Collegiate Training Initiative (AT-CTI).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- High school diploma or high school equivalent
- Check the catalog to learn about all course and program prerequisites

FOR THOSE PURSUING AT-CTI DESIGNATION

in order to apply for Air Traffic Controller positions with the FAA, graduates must:

1. Be younger than 31 years old;
2. Be a U.S. citizen; and
3. Pass medical, psychological and background security checks.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When can I start?

FSCJ enrolls students year-round.

Students pursuing Air Traffic Control must complete ATT 1810 before joining a cohort in the Spring Term. Students who take this course in a spring or summer term must wait until the following spring to join a cohort.

Where are the educational courses held?

General education courses are offered at any of FSCJ's campuses and centers, as well as online. Aviation courses for this program are offered at FSCJ Cecil Center.

What is the cost of the program?

Many students attending FSCJ qualify for financial aid, which can greatly reduce out-of-pocket expenses. This program is Federal financial aid eligible. *The approximate cost of tuition and fees is \$6,293.**

Besides tuition and fees, students have to pay for things like living expenses, transportation, supplies and books. Book costs vary widely by program and course selection as well as choice of electives; students are encouraged to budget about \$80 per credit hour.

**Tuition reflects Florida resident rates and are subject to change. Certain classes that require labs may have additional fees for lab supplies. Additional fees are published in the class schedule.*

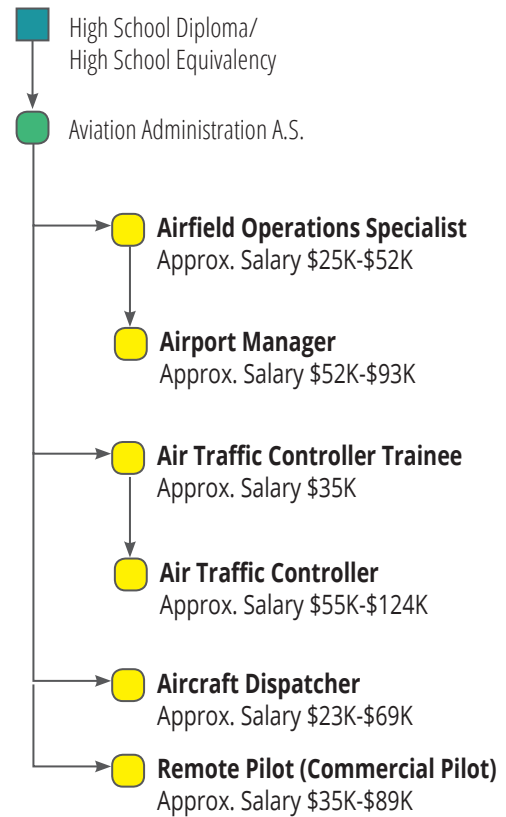
