QEP Update - Fall 2023

As the semester is coming to end, we are excited to share the updates of QueST for the Fall 2023 Term. QueST has officially begun its pilot phase, which started in summer 2023. Several cohorts of faculty have successfully completed PD 1896, while students continue to self-enroll in the QueST Online to Orientation Canvas course.

What is QueST?

QueST, Quality e-Learning for Students and Teachers, is the name for FSCJ's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP). QueST focuses on improving student success in asynchronous online classes, over a five-year period of time.

In addition to our efforts to ensure students have the technology and skills necessary to complete online courses with a grade of C or higher, QueST also supports your faculty team as they develop and deliver online courses.

There are two main outcomes of the QEP: 1) Increase productive grade rates in online courses; and 2) Reduce withdrawal rates in online courses. To achieve the QEP goals, QueST will involve two strategies: 1) an orientation to online learning for students and 2) a professional development program for faculty preparing to teach online.

SACSCOC Reaffirmation Visit

The SACSCOC on-site reaffirmation visit was held on October 23-26, 2023. Members of several of the QEP subcommittees met with the SACSCOC on-site committee members to discuss the work done throughout the exploratory, developmental and pilot phases. The onsite review committee had no recommendations for the QEP, but complimented the strong process, support from leadership, staff, and faculty, and the College's commitment to improving student success in asynchronous online courses.

Thank you to the members of the QEP committees, those who have attended professional learning sessions, and those who have provided feedback along the way. A special thank you to the faculty and faculty mentors who have completed PD 1896.
