Get to Know... Deborah Williams



Higher education is the stock and trade of my family. I have had sisters, brothers, nephews, nieces, and cousins working at colleges and universities all over the country during my lifetime, and it has turned out to be the perfect choice for me. I began my career in higher education as a part-time librarian at Keiser University's Jacksonville, Florida campus in 2008 while completing a master's degree in Library and Information Science. I was fortunate to

be offered and accept a full time Campus Librarian position in 2010. During my time there I worked closely with community partners and received the Bridge Builder award in 2015 for planning and spearheading an annual children's book drive during Family Literacy month in September. The donated books benefitting the Early Learning Coalition (ELC) of Duval county. The ELC of Duval county provides a book to children visiting their offices to promote early literacy. In 2019, we collected over 1500 children's books in 30 days from our campus community which were used to replenish supply. Imagine what would happen if every college library did that.

Although I work in higher education, I am passionate about the impact of family literacy and learning on future college success. Today's fouryear old learning to read proficiently is possibly tomorrow's successful community college student and the parent is very likely a community college student today.

I began working as a part-time librarian at Florida State College at Jacksonville's Deerwood Center Library and Learning Commons in 2014. I developed an affinity for the mission of the community college there

In 2018, I completed an Educational Specialist degree at the University of West Florida, and I am currently a doctoral candidate in the process of completing my dissertation for the Doctor of Education degree in Curriculum and Assessment.
