Greetings FSCJ Family. After 15 months of enduring the trying times of the COVID-19 pandemic, I am delighted to share that FSCJ will have much more normal operations come Fall Term 2021. Our class schedule this fall nearly mirrors the onthe-ground options that were provided in Fall 2019. We will also continue to offer the "Live Online" option that proved to be a successful choice for many of our students looking for an alternative for fully online or in-person courses.

I have shared this many times, but this team – this college community that we have at FSCJ is committed to our students and a force to be reckoned with.
