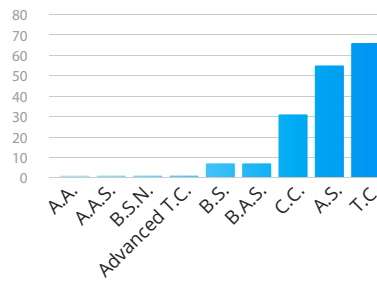

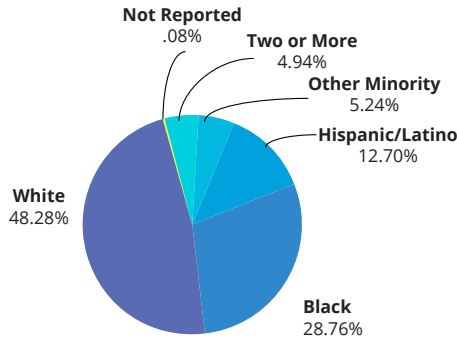

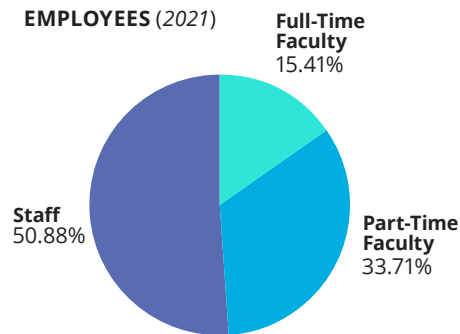

NOTABLE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Aspen Institute named FSCJ one of the 150 institutions eligible to compete for the \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, the nation's signature recognition of high achievement and performance among America's community colleges.
- FSCJ was selected as a winner of the 2021 Most Promising Places to Work in Community Colleges award by the National Institute for Staff and Organizational Development (NISOD).
- FSCJ's Culinary Management Associate in Science (A.S.) degree program was identified as "Exemplary" and accredited by the American Culinary Federation Education Foundation's Accrediting Commission (ACFEFAC) through 2026.
- FSCJ was awarded a 2021 IDEAS Grant (Increase and Diversify Education Abroad for U.S. Students) under the Capacity Building Program for U.S. Study Abroad by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, and World Learning. The College will use the grant to develop a virtual exchange program through a partnership with an international university for FSCJ B.S.N. students.
- FSCJ received a \$3,181,791.70 Florida Job Growth Grant from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and Enterprise Florida to support the Nassau County Transportation Education Institute. The grant award will allow the College to establish a designated truck driving training facility at the Nassau Center.
