



## Radiation Therapy (2163) | A.S. Degree

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Associate in Science (A.S.) in Radiation Therapy is designed for individuals who wish to become certified in the field of Radiation Therapy.

This program, which follows the recommended core curriculum of the American Society of Radiologic Technologists (ASRT), is designed to enhance the educational experience and employment potential for students in a hospital or freestanding clinic setting.

Graduates must sit and pass the National Registry examination for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT).

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- High school diploma or high school equivalent
- Submit completed program application by the May 15 deadline. New cohorts begin in the fall of even numbered years (2020, 2022, etc.)
- Forward official college transcripts to the College
- ENC1101, MAC1105, BSC2085C, CGS 1060 or 1100 courses must be completed before applying to the program
- General Education Social Science, Humanities, BSC2086C and HSC1531 must be completed before the program begins
- Check the catalog to learn about all course and program prerequisites

***FSCJ is accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. This regional accreditation meets the ARRT requirement for an accredited program and graduates will be eligible to sit for the national registry examination upon program completion.***

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### When can I start?

New student enrollment for this program begins every other year during the Fall Term on even numbered years. However, FSCJ enrolls students year-round.

Application Deadline: May 15

### Where are the educational courses held?

General education courses are offered at any of FSCJ's campuses and centers, as well as online. The professional core courses for this program are offered at FSCJ North Campus.

### What is the cost of the program?

Many students attending FSCJ qualify for financial aid, which can greatly reduce out-of-pocket expenses.

This program is Federal financial aid eligible. *The approximate cost of tuition and fees is \$8,076.\**

Besides tuition and fees, students have to pay for things like living expenses, transportation, supplies and books. Book costs vary widely by program and course selection as well as choice of electives; students are encouraged to budget about \$80 per credit hour.

*\*Tuition reflects Florida resident rates and are subject to change. Certain classes that require labs may have additional fees for lab supplies. Additional fees are published in the class schedule.*

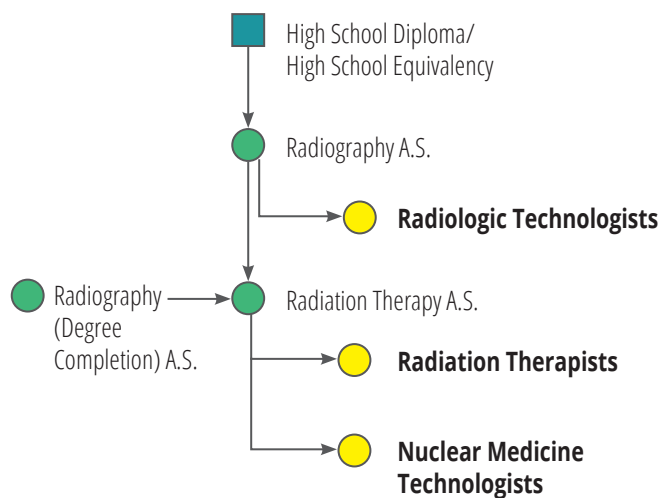
