

Types of Financial Aid

FSCJ students may be eligible for the following types of financial aid:

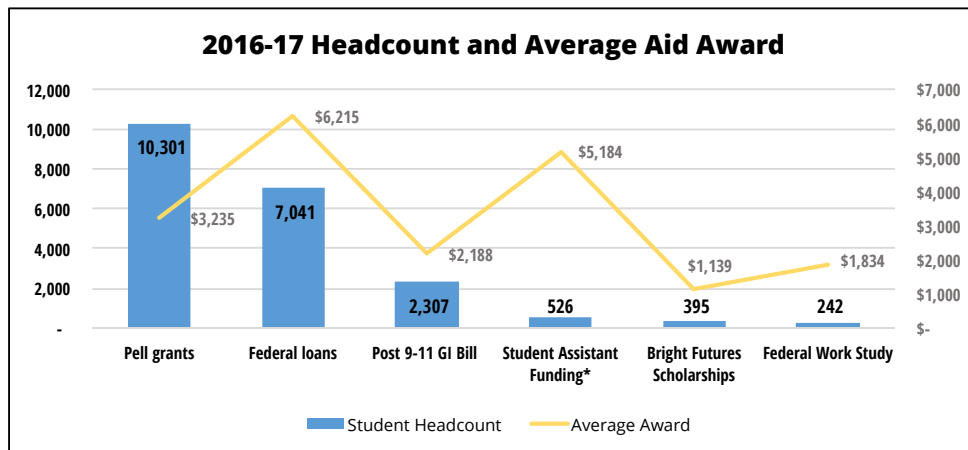
- Federal grants, scholarships and loans
- State grants and scholarships
- Institutional grants and more than 200 scholarships in areas such as athletics, fine arts, co-curricular and FSCJ Promise
(More than 112 students were eligible for FSCJ Promise in fall 2017)
- Military and veterans benefits
- Foundation/private donor scholarships
- Student employment

(e.g., Federal Work Study, Florida Work Experience Program, student assistant funding)

In 2017-18, FSCJ will strive for increased utilization of student employment opportunities and market placement with community partners and implement a developmental framework.

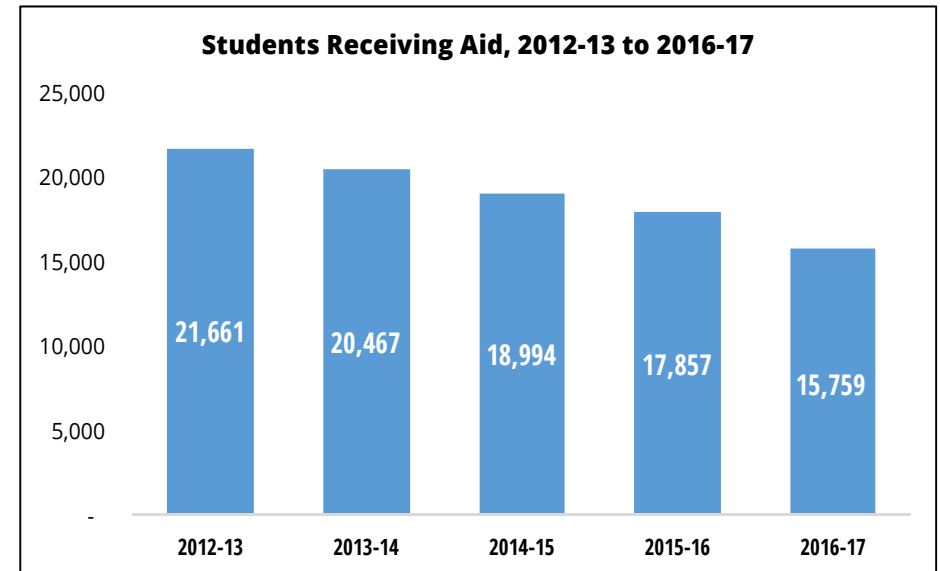
Fun Facts

In 2016-17, **29,012** students received **\$94,114,867** in aid from the federal government, state or local government, the College and other sources.



Data Note: To determine the average award, the total amount paid was divided by the headcount of students receiving aid. These figures are a sample of aid received.

* Student assistants who worked an average of 20 hours a week at \$8.10 per hour earned \$5,184 over two terms.



Data Note: Note that not all students are enrolled in financial aid-eligible programs.

Quick Tips

- All current and prospective students are eligible to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov.
- FAFSA is required to apply for federal aid and may also be used to determine eligibility for other types of financial aid.
- Students and their parents (if dependent) will need a FSA ID to sign their application electronically. To apply for an FSA ID, students and parents can visit fsaid.ed.gov.
- The FAFSA application is available on **October 1st** of each year and students should complete the application annually.
