- Ten percent of the world is left-handed

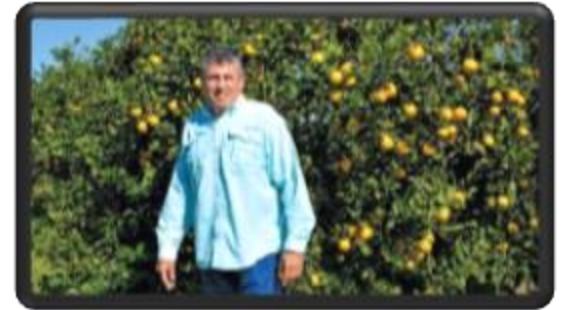

Pandemic Impact on Current & Future Students

- K-12 "Covid Slide" Learning Loss
 - Closing schools and offering hybrid learning during the start of the pandemic protected the health of students and staff, but it also led to many children falling behind in their studies.
 - In 2021, schools serving some of Duval County's poorest students took some of the biggest hits on Florida's standardized testing. Officials say absenteeism is largely to blame.

Pandemic Impact on Current & Future Students

- Finances

- A national CCCSE survey in 2021 found that 34% of students reported their personal finance situation was worse than it was prior to the pandemic.
- Non-traditional students (25 years and older) and full-time students were most likely to report their financial situation was worse.



Pandemic Impact on Current & Future Students

- Mental Health Challenges
 - In 2021, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and the Children's Hospital Association declared that the pandemic-related decline in child and adolescent mental health has become a national emergency.
 - On top of social isolation and family instability, the medical groups said, "more than 140,000 children in the United States lost a primary and/or secondary caregiver, with youth of color disproportionately impacted."

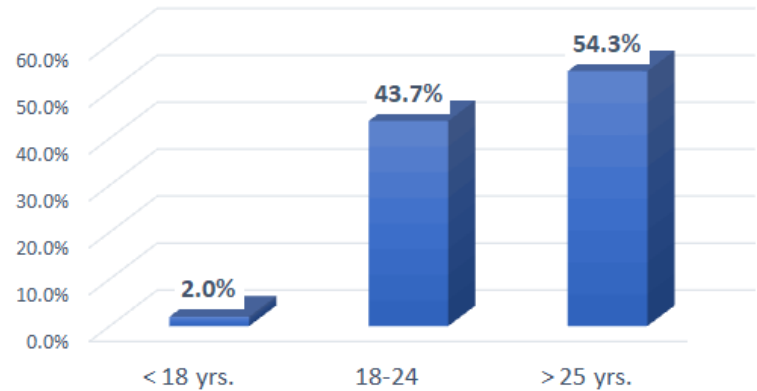

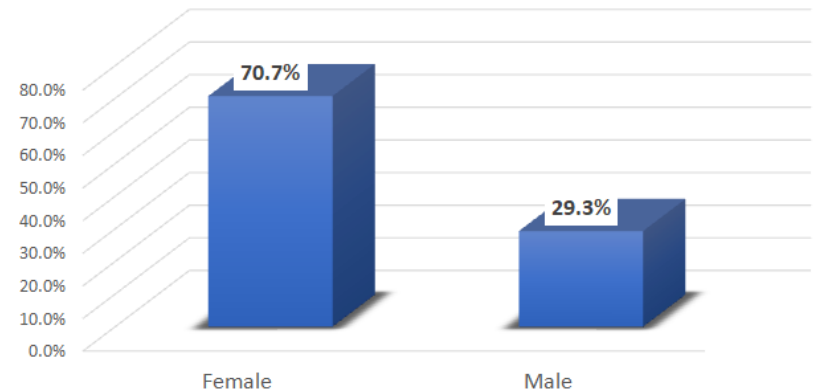
Logged Into myGradPlan

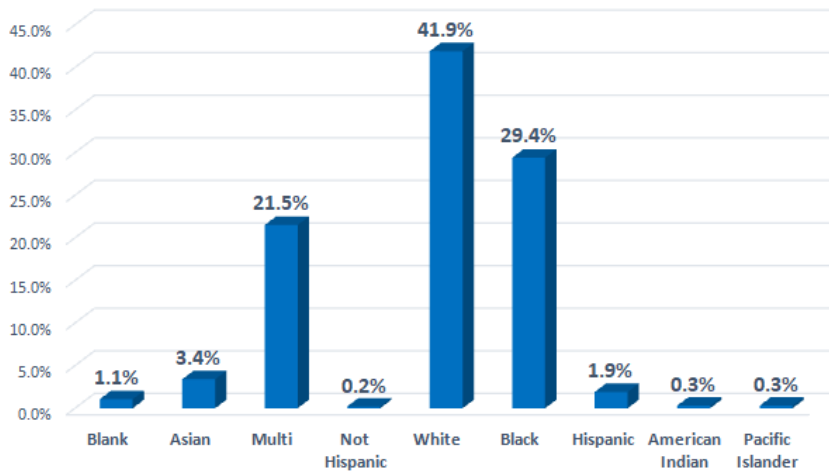

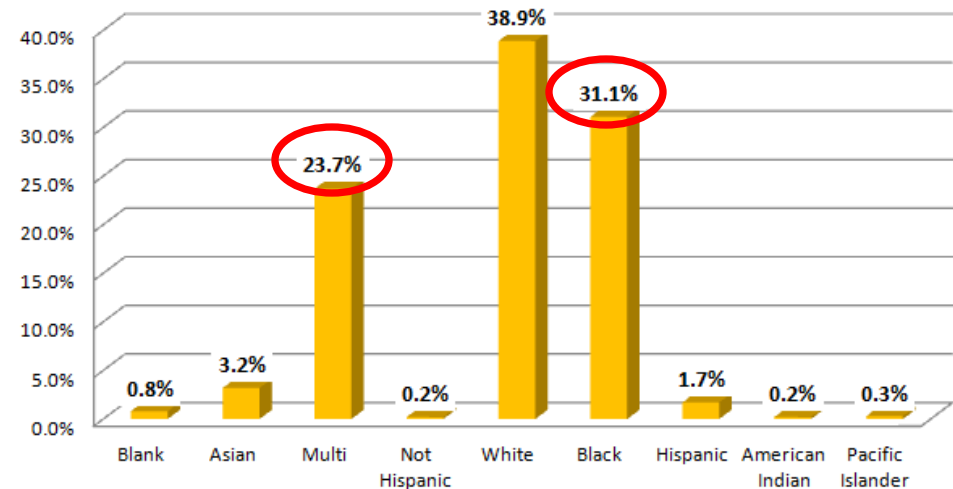


Concerned About Balancing Responsibilities

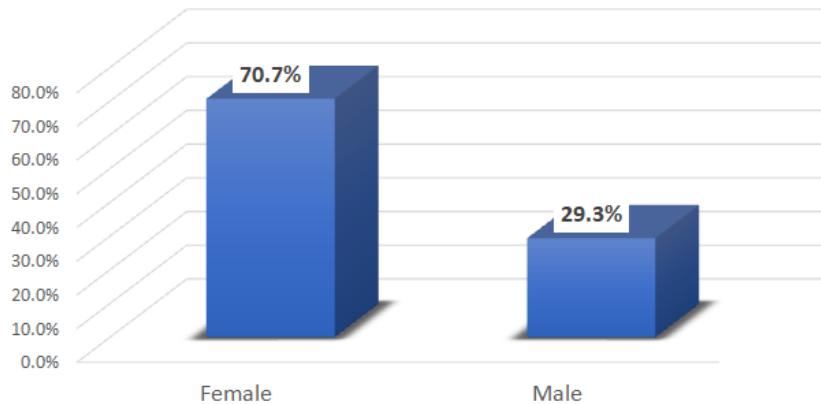


Concerned About Balancing Responsibilities

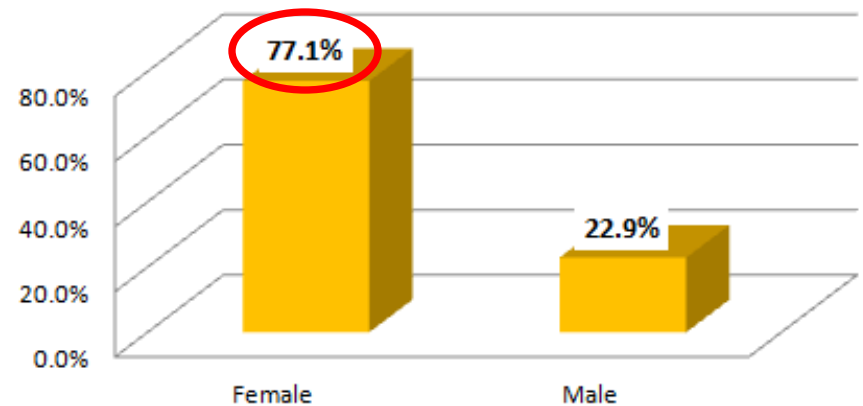

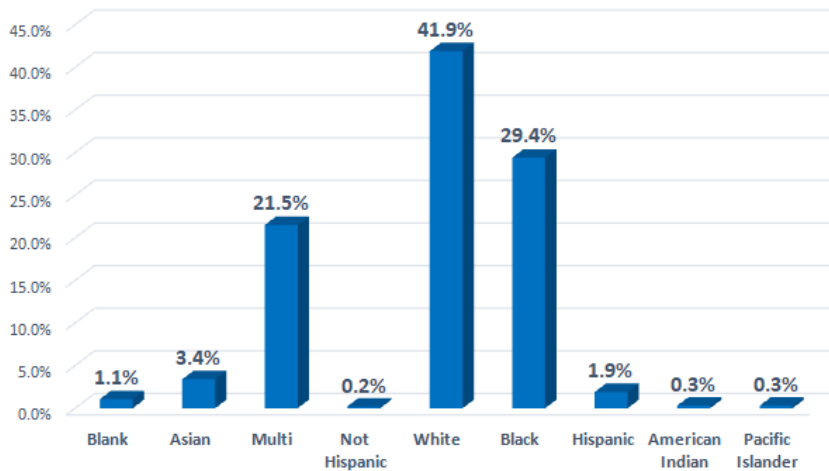

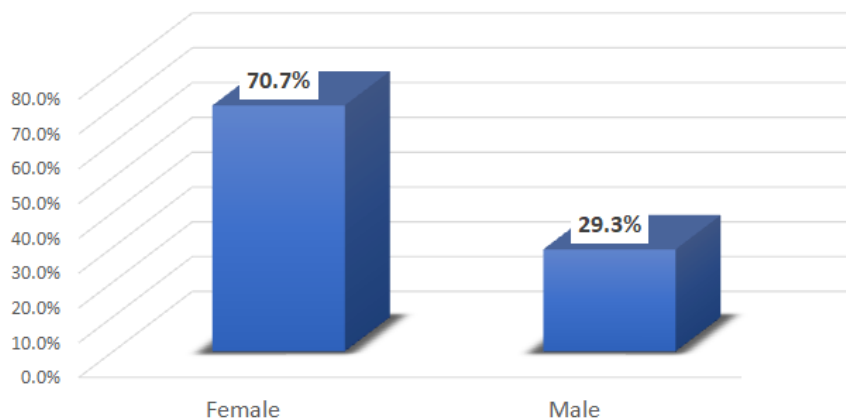

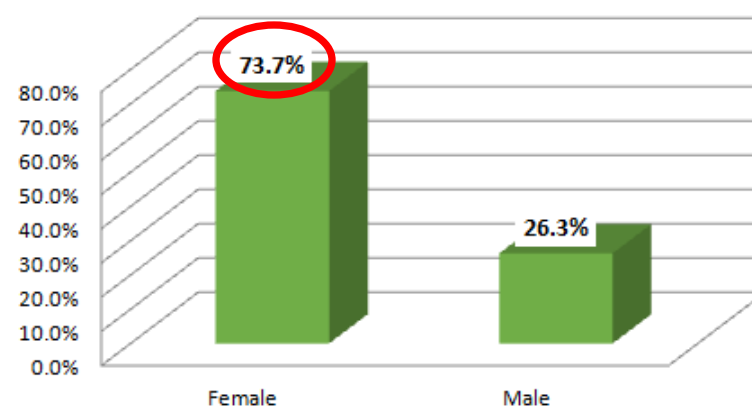

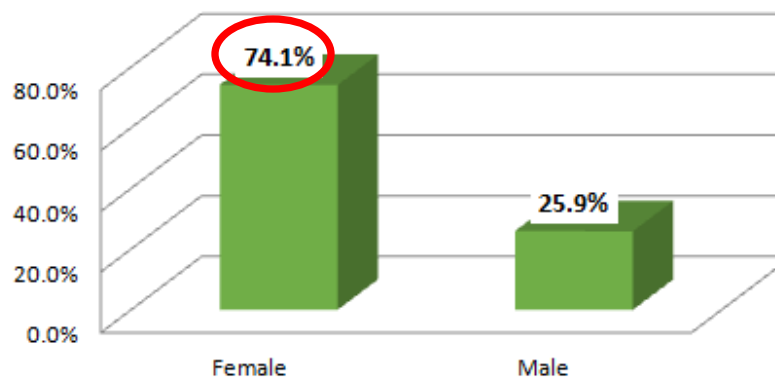

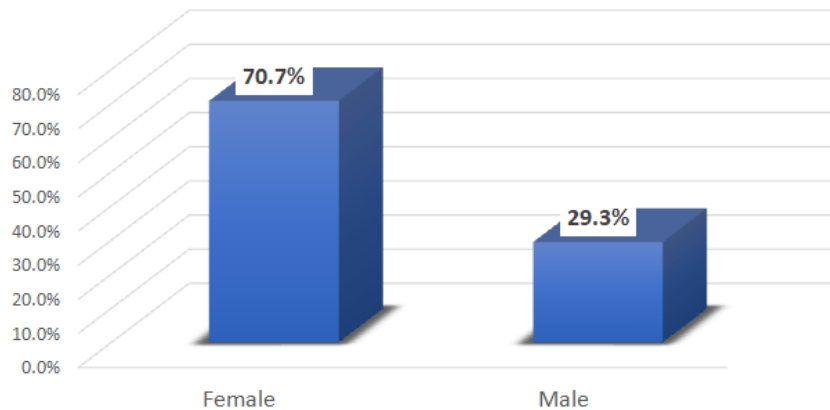


Concerned About Passing Classes and Enrolled

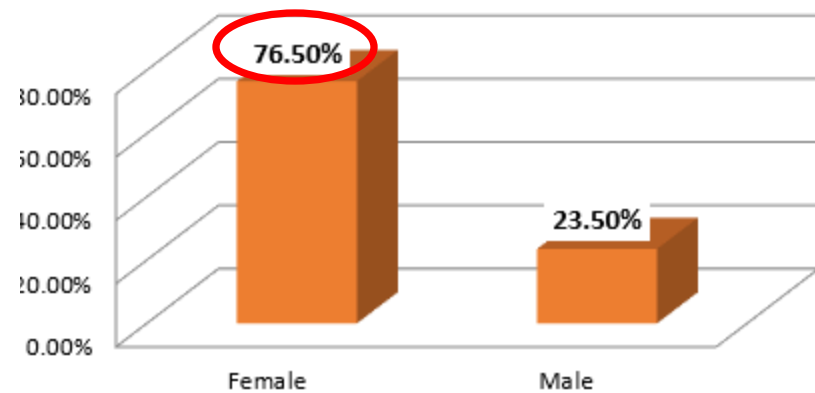

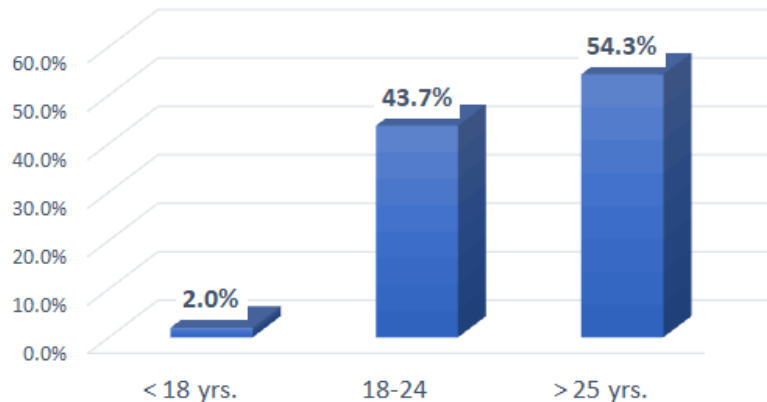


Concerned About Supporting My Well-Being

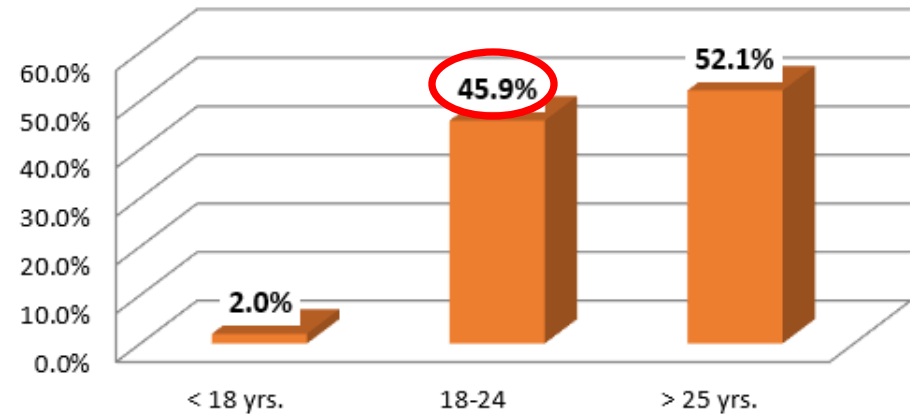

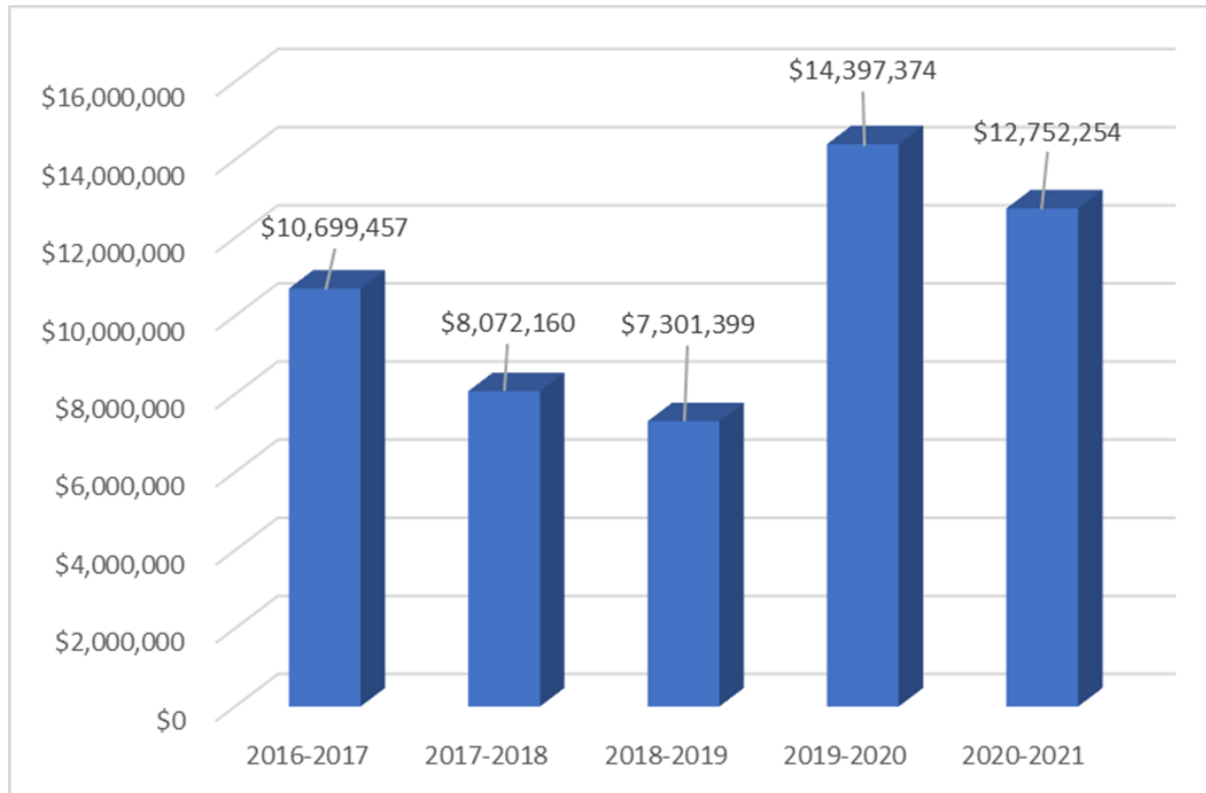

Grants Focusing on Holistic Student Supports – *Food Security*

- H.O.P.E. Food Pantry Initiative
 - Funder: Florida Blue
 - Amount: \$399,881
 - Description: This project will serve at least 6,000 college students in Northeast Florida by providing food, educational programs and wraparound support services to assist students in the successful pursuit of their academic and personal journeys.



Grants Focusing on Holistic Student Supports – *Child Care*



- Child Care Means Parents in Schools Program (CCAMPIS)
 - Funder: U.S. Department of Education
 - Amount: \$460,556
- Description: Assists student parents with the cost of keeping their children enrolled in quality, accredited and conveniently located childcare services.

Grants Focusing on Holistic Student Supports – *Technology Access*

- Bridging the Digital Divide
 - Funder: Northeast Florida Community Foundation
 - Amount: \$25,000
 - Description: Expands FSCJ's laptop checkout program, further assesses students' technology needs/existing digital literacy skills and teaches students digital literacy skills through a variety of active-learning methods and multi-media platforms.

- TRIO Student Support Services-STEM
 - Funder: U.S. Department of Education
 - Amount: \$261,888 annually
 - Description: Located at FSCJ North Campus since 2010, TRiO SSS-STEM provides individual and group services to 160 students. Its mission is to increase the academic success, retention and graduate rates of first generation (neither parent/guardian has completed a bachelor's degree), low-income students and individuals with a disability. TRiO SSS provides a consistent and ongoing support system that program participants depend upon throughout their time here at FSCJ.

Nathan H. Wilson Endowment for Minority Student Success and Retention

- Applications due March 25, 2022
- The endowment's purpose is to increase minority student success/retention and close equity gaps.
- Applications will be accepted from one full-time faculty member OR Joint proposals from a full-time faculty member with 1) another full-time faculty member, 2) a full-time student services employee, 3) academic support employee, or 4) adjunct faculty member.
- Selected faculty members will utilize teaching methods either in a 1) specific course or 2) learning event outside the classroom. Faculty members are encouraged to use evidence-based research when developing their intervention.
