<p><b>District 110:</b> Part of Miami-Dade</p>	<p><b>District 21:</b> Consists of Manatee, and part of Hillsborough</p>
<p>The Speaker of the house leads the Florida House of Representatives for a two-year term. The speaker presides over the House, appoints committee members and committee chairs, influences the placement of bills on the calendar, and rules on procedural motions.</p>	<p>The Senate President is a constitutional officer who leads the Florida Senate for a two-year term. The President, who is elected by members of the Senate, manages the operations of the Senate and presides over its sessions. The President's many duties include: selecting a Majority Leader, and appointing Senators to standing Senate committees, appointing committee chairs.</p>



# Bill Tracking

<b>HB 839</b>	Requires employees or officers of a FCS institution be included in Department of Management Services' website; Requires BOG and SBE to report on intellectual freedom and viewpoint diversity at each SUS and FCS institution; Requires the Commissioner of Education to submit recommendations to the SBE and the Legislature for the most efficient process to achieve a complete performance-based model. <b><i>New adopted amendments would make FCS salaries more transparent; now requires FCS institutions to participate in viewpoint diversity survey; may have impact on performance funding metrics in the future.</i></b>	Placed on Special Order Calendar 4/17/19
<b>HB 189</b>	Provides certain reporting requirements for certain postsecondary institutions; revises provisions relating to dual enrollment programs; requiring private school articulation agreements to prohibit certain costs from being passed along to private schools; renames Collegiate high school programs as early college acceleration programs. <b><i>Would have fiscal impact by requiring FSCJ to absorb costs of private school dual enrollment, would increase private school dual enrollment; lower GPA requirement would increase dual enrollment across the board.</i></b>	Favorable with CS by Education Committee 4/9/19
<b>HB 7071</b>	Revises provisions relating to apprenticeships and preapprenticeships, State Apprenticeship Advisory Council, statewide articulation agreement, career centers, Florida College System institutions, and workforce program funding; establishes SAIL to 60 Initiative; renames Higher Education Coordinating Council as Florida Talent Development Council and revises duties; creates FLAG program. <b><i>Promotes apprenticeship programs.</i></b>	Placed on Calendar, on 2 <sup>nd</sup> reading
<b>HB 7055</b>	Revises provisions related to career education and district school board duties, high school graduation requirements and diploma designations, school grade calculations, career center requirements, and CAPE Industry Certification Funding List. <b><i>Promotes CAPE Industry Certification programs to meet workforce demands.</i></b>	Now in Education Committee
<b>SB 194</b>	Florida College System institutions and state universities to execute agreements to establish 2+2 targeted pathway programs; requiring district school boards to notify students about credit-by-examination and dual enrollment equivalency lists, etc. <b><i>Promotes pathways for students in 2+2 programs and may impact articulation agreements.</i></b>	Now on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education 4/16/19
<b>HB 217</b>	Provides process for award of postsecondary credit for military experience and credentials; requires specified postsecondary institutions to waive transcript fee for active duty members of Armed Forces of United States, certain veterans, and their spouses and dependents. <b><i>May have small fiscal impact but will support veterans.</i></b>	Placed on Calendar, on 2 <sup>nd</sup> reading
<b>HB 1197</b>	Authorizes state universities and Florida College System institutions to sponsor charter schools; revises reporting and accountability requirements; provides for funding; authorizes career and professional academy to be offered by charter school. <b><i>Would allow FSCJ to create a charter school, which is not a priority for FSCJ at this time.</i></b>	Now in Appropriations Committee
<b>SB 1316</b>	Revising the requirements for a standard high school diploma to include a specified course; establishing the Florida Seal of Civic Engagement Program; providing that earning the Seal of Civic Engagement demonstrates competency in civic literacy for specified purposes, etc. <b><i>Adds an option to demonstrate competency in civic literacy.</i></b>	Now in Approps Subcommittee on Education
<b>SB1640</b>	Relating to state regulated professions. <b><i>Committee Substitute adopted April 8, 2019 removes most amendments to interior designer licensing.</i></b>	Now in Appropriations
