
FSCJ Hosts Scheidel Leadership in Action Award Luncheon

## Get to Know Your APC Colleagues: Patrice Williams



April's Administrative & Professional Collaborative (APC) spotlight shines on Continuing Workforce Education (CWE) Program Manager Patrice Williams.

Patrice's journey in education began with a permanent parttime position in Continuing Education before transitioning to a full-time role in Distance Learning in 1998, when FCCJ offered telecourses on TV. In 2000, she left to pursue a career at CSX, later returning in 2004, joining the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) department, where she dedicated 17 years to serving students. During that time, she wore many hats—from advisor to project coordinator overseeing a refugee grant program that supported more than 300 students.

In her current role, one of Patrice's key responsibilities is managing the English Language Institute (ELI) for non-credit international students who seek to learn English before transitioning to a degree program.
