FSCJ Receives \$1.5 Million Gift from Anonymous Donors

FSCJ received a \$1.5 million donation from anonymous donors to support the Stepping Stones program. In combination with many previous gifts, this donation makes these longtime donors the largest in the FSCJ Foundation's 52-year history.

Funds will provide critical resources, including direct student financial assistance, educational materials, classroom supplies, certification testing fees and required background checks for healthcare-related fields. It will also cover essentials such as uniforms, books, tools and instructional materials, as well as vital support services that help students overcome personal barriers to education.

"We are humbled by the selfless generosity of these benefactors who have a longstanding relationship with FSCJ and Stepping Stones. This gift is their way to ensure this program is efficacious for even more students for years to come," said Dr. A.

Register for the Spring Data Summit: Community College 3.0 & FSCJ's Role in Community Vibrancy

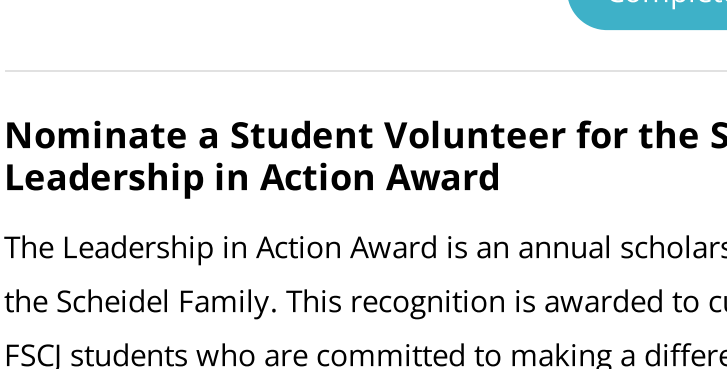

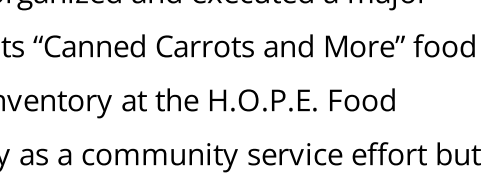

Nominate a Student Volunteer for the Scheidel Leadership in Action Award

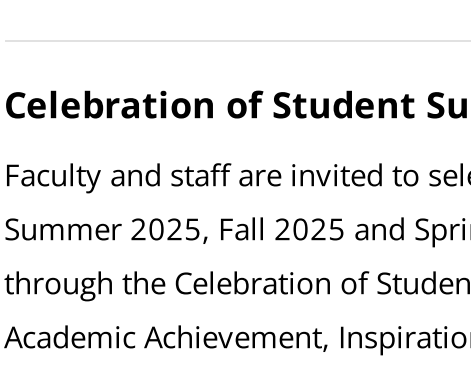

Logistics and Supply Chain Management Club Service Learning Supports Food Pantry

FSCJ's Logistics and Supply Chain Management Club, under the direction of Dr. Susan Amburgey, organized and executed a major service-learning initiative through its "Canned Carrots and More" food drive, significantly increasing the inventory at the H.O.P.E. Food Pantry. This project served not only as a community service effort but also as a meaningful learning opportunity, demonstrating how classroom concepts come to life and how students can uplift one another through shared purpose.

Students engaged in activities that mirrored professional logistics operations, such as receiving goods, conducting inventory counts, performing quality checks, weighing and packaging items, and preparing detailed packing slips. They also prioritized items based on expiration dates, condition and importance, using inventory management methods to organize and stock the pantry shelves.

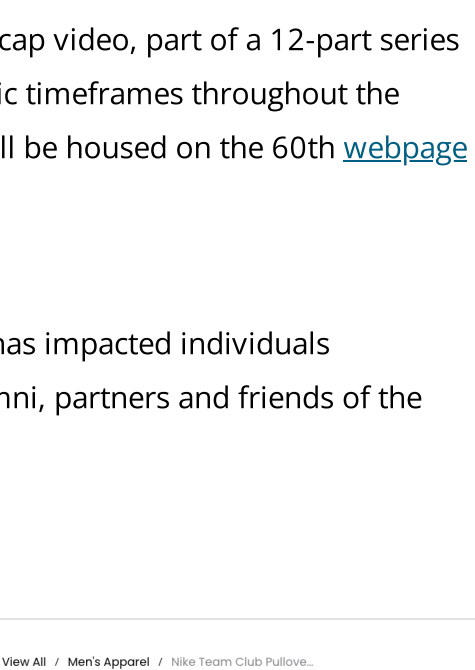
The students collected 3,039 items weighing 1,906 pounds, with a total value of \$4,018. All donations were packed by the students, with assistance from Club Member Alan Barrera who served as the Logistics Lab Assistant and is a B.A.S. Logistics student.

60th Anniversary Celebration Continues

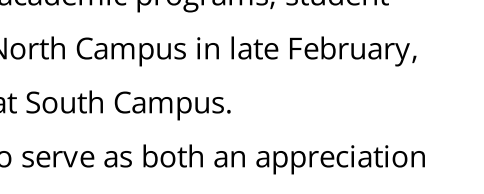

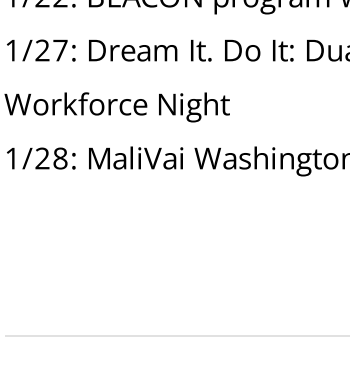

The Student Recruitment Office is preparing to launch a mix of long-standing recruitment events with a new initiative. In 2026, our approach will include:

- Campus Discovery Days - Replacing the traditional mid-June Open House, Campus Discovery Days will expand our outreach through a four-event series highlighting academic programs, student services and campus life at each campus. The series will begin at North Campus in late February, continue at Kent and Downtown campuses, and conclude in May at South Campus.

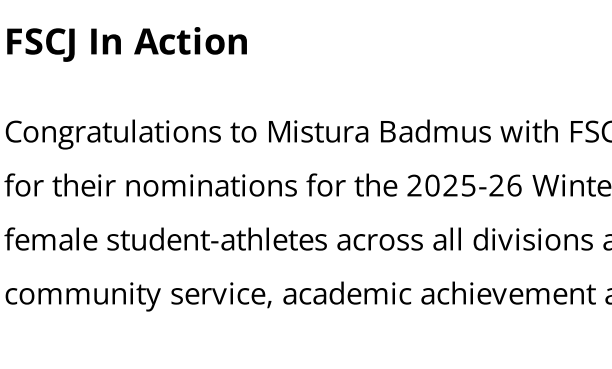

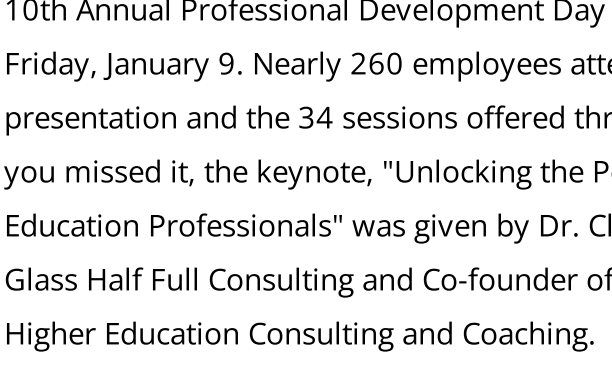

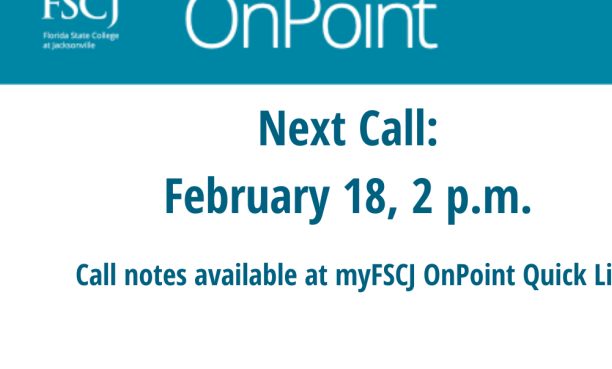
FSCJ In Action



