We were honored to celebrate the achievements of our proud graduates during the 57th annual Commencement Ceremony on Thursday, May 9 at VyStar Veterans Memorial Arena. Surrounded by an audience of their families and friends, students who completed FSCJ's bachelor's and associate degree programs accepted their diplomas from FSCJ President John Avendano, Ph.D., and the College's District Board of Trustees.

More than 3,300 degrees were awarded to FSCJ graduates and candidates for the 2023-24 academic year. Of these, 1,747 are associate in arts degrees, 887 are associate in science degrees and 729 are bachelor's degrees.

The coveted trophy is given each year to the campus/center with the highest percentage of donors. Congratulations to this year's winner: Nassau Center!






FSCJ Partners with Brooks Rehab to Help CNAs Advance Their Career

FSCJ and Brooks Rehabilitation have partnered to offer certified nursing assistants (CNAs) an opportunity to work toward becoming a licensed practical nurse (LPN) while on the job. Together, Brooks and FSCJ created this pilot program which allows a cohort of 11 Brooks Rehabilitation CNAs opportunities to work with FSCJ instructors during the workday. Their tuition is covered by Brooks and laptops, scrubs and supplies are also provided.

The first cohort will graduate in summer 2024 and will then take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) to become LPNs. To date, all have passed their coursework and standardized tests.



Recruitment Update

Earlier this month, the Student Recruitment office successfully concluded FSCJ Takeover Days at the Nassau Center and South and North campuses. After the well-received launch last year in Nassau County, two additional days were added to the 2023-24 calendar. Nearly 200 seniors took advantage of the opportunity to complete their enrollment steps, attend mock classes taught by FSCJ faculty, meet other students planning to attend in the fall and explore our center/campus offerings. During the three days, 59 students applied and 53 students received advising and registration assistance.

Focus now shifts to the annual Collegewide Open House which will be Saturday, June 15 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at South Campus.
