Giving Tuesday is December 3





Congratulations to the Office of Workforce Development on winning the 2024 Ratcliffe Pitch for Skilled Trades Grant during the National Association of Community College Entrepreneurs (NACCE) Skilled Trades competition. The \$40,000 grant will help expand the barbering program to Kent Campus and serve even more future barbers.



Community colleges from across the nation pitched innovative programs that enhance local workforce development during the NACCE competition, held during the organization's annual conference in Minneapolis, MN. Our very own Dr. Cedrick Gibson, Julie Stein, Carissa Gardner and Joe Lackey came out on top after presenting their case for expanding the barbering program, which is currently limited to 10 students.


FSCJ Foundation Celebrates Endowment Donors at Legacy Luncheon


