

The Advanced Technical Certificate (A.T.C.) in Paralegal Studies educates, trains, and develops students for careers as paralegals and legal assistants.

The curriculum focuses on the study of legal theory and substantive areas of the law, and incorporates the practical application of law to develop the skills necessary to succeed in the profession. The program emphasizes legal research, writing, law related technology, communication, ethics, and critical thinking skills so that students enter the legal profession well prepared.
