

About the Program

The Career Certificate (C.C.) in Barbering prepares students for employment as barbers.

Upon completion of this program, students will be prepared for the following certifications or licenses: Barbering License via Department of Business Profession and Regulations (DBPR).

Note: If you are considering employment in a state other than Florida, please visit fscj.edu/academics/license-disclose to determine if this program will meet the selected state's educational requirements to sit for licensure or certification testing.

Related Career Pathways include: Licensed Barber, Salon Owner, Educator, Image Consultant and Hair Care Product Representative.

Program Requirements

This program requires 900 contact/clock hours that must be completed and documented. Students should also understand and accept the attendance requirements prior to enrolling in this career certificate program. This program is eligible for financial aid.

Adult Basic Skills are a major criterion in students' completion of the program. For more information, please see an advisor.

Barbering can be completed in 8 months or approximately two terms. Students have the option of attending the day or evening program. Attendance for this program is state mandated; therefore, before you begin the application process, please ensure that you will be able to attend 100% of the course.

Students are encouraged to review the Florida application requirements for barbering prior to applying to the Barbering program. The application requirements are available on the Florida Department of Business & Professional Regulation website.

Catalog Year

This document is prepared for students with a 2025-26 College Catalog year. Students who enter under the 2025-26 catalog will be assigned to the degree or certificate requirements in effect during the 2025-26 academic year. The student's assigned catalog year will remain in effect as long as the student maintains continuous enrollment. Changes to requirements as mandated by law or by rule of the District Board of Trustees may supersede this provision.

To maintain continuous enrollment, a student must have registration for, and successful completion of, at least one course within a three-term period. After three consecutive terms of no enrollment, the student will be discontinued from the current program of study and will need to apply to FSCJ to reenter under the same program of study. Upon readmission, the student will be assigned to the current catalog of record in the chosen program.
