About the Program

The Career Certificate (C.C.) in Correctional Officer provides students with criminal justice training and education to prepare them to manage inmates and perform operational duties in the areas of care, custody and control within the correctional institution.

This program requires **420 contact/clock hours** that must be completed and documented. Students should also understand and accept the attendance requirements prior to enrolling in this career certificate program. This program **is not eligible** for financial aid.

Program Requirements

This is a Limited Access Program.

Important for You to Know

This academic roadmap does not include career certificate graduation requirements.

Currently, all Basic Corrections classes are comprised of **students that have been hired by the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO)**. To apply to JSO, visit <u>http://JoinJSO.com/</u>. Students are required to pass the Criminal Justice Basic Abilities Test (CJBAT) for Corrections (CO) prior to entry into the program. Upon completion of this program along with a passing score on the State Officer Certification Examination, students will obtain a Certificate of Corrections valid throughout the state of Florida. This is a basic certification; additional training will be required by the hiring agency.

Note: If you are considering employment in a state other than Florida, please visit <u>https://www.fscj.edu/academics/license-disclose</u> to determine if this program will meet the selected state's educational requirements to sit for licensure or certification testing.

Record of Conviction of a Crime: If the students enroll in an internship or cooperative education class and are seeking experience at a law enforcement agency or facility under Children and Family Services then a background check is performed by the law enforcement agency or facility, and the student may be denied employment (paid or non-paid) based on their criminal record.

Related Career Pathways include the following: A.S. in Criminal Justice Technology, Crossover from Corrections Officer to Law Enforcement Officer.

Students who have completed the Correctional Officer program and passed the State Officer Certification Examination are **eligible to earn 9 credit hours** toward an A.S. degree in Criminal Justice Technology.
