Medical Assisting Specialist (6015)

The Technical Certificate (T.C.) in Medical Assisting Specialist prepares students to perform medical assisting duties under the direction of a physician/practitioner.

Duties include preparing examination rooms, taking vital signs, assisting in minor surgical procedures, giving injections, performing venipuncture, assisting in laboratory operations, taking x-rays, and administering electrocardiograms. Medical assistants also learn to function in an administrative capacity, including patient communications, patient record maintenance, billing, scheduling appointments, ordering supplies, and processing insurance claims.

Important for You to Know

This academic roadmap does not include developmental education courses in reading, writing, and/or mathematics that you may be required to take. Students who place into developmental education courses are required to complete designated developmental education courses with a grade of C or higher regardless of program of study. In addition, it does not include MAT 1033: Intermediate Algebra, which, for many students, is a prerequisite course for MAC 1105.
