



## About the Program

The Technical Certificate (T.C.) in Emergency Medical Technician prepares graduates to function as entry-level emergency medical technicians. Graduates are eligible to apply to sit for the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) EMT certification exam to qualify for certification as a Florida EMT and a National Registered EMT. Note: If you are considering employment in a state other than Florida, please visit <u>fscj.edu/academics/license-disclose</u> to determine if this program will meet the selected state's educational requirements to sit for licensure or certification testing.

#### **Program Requirements**

This program requires a minimum of 12 credit hours. Total program hours may vary based on the student's individual academic plan. This program is not eligible for financial aid.

Students in this program are not required to complete math courses unless they are listed as part of the certificate program. If you plan to pursue the degree program in this same field, please note this certificate articulates directly into the Emergency Medical Services (E.M.S.) (2201) (A.S.) and Fire Science Technology (2911) (A.S.) degrees, which include Mathematical Thinking in Context math pathways. #### **Application Procedure**

This is a Limited Access program. Acceptance into the Emergency Medical Technician program is based upon academic performance and other criteria. A cohort is admitted each term. To be considered, individuals must complete the following by the appropriate application deadline:

	Submit to a criminal background check (national);
	Submit to a drug screening;
	Provide proof of a physical examination;
	Provide proof of immunizations (rubella, German measles, mumps, varicella, H1N1 virus, hepatitis B, tuberculosis, and flu shot).
	Provide proof of current driver's license;
	Provide proof of current personal injury protection (PIP) insurance coverage; and
	Provide proof of current health insurance coverage;
	Provide proof of current Basic Life Support provider (BLS) card (front and back). The approved providers are: American Heart Association (AHA) - Course

Additional information will be provided at the program orientation.

**Note:** Admissions preference is given to fully qualified candidates who have met all entrance criteria, including the satisfaction of prerequisite courses. Should seats remain available in the program cohort, applicants who fulfill admissions criteria prior to the start of the program will be considered next.

# **Application Deadlines**

The application deadlines are:

- May 15 for day classes starting in the fall term
- September 15 for day classes starting in the spring term
- February 15 for night classes starting in the summer term

## Placement Testing

Please meet with an advisor to determine if college placement testing is required. Students who place into developmental education courses are required to complete designated developmental education courses with a grade of C or higher regardless of program of study and are also required to take one of two student success strategies courses. # Catalog Year

This document is prepared for students with a 2025-26 College Catalog year who have not tested into developmental education courses. Students who enter under the 2025-26 catalog will be assigned to the degree or certificate requirements in effect during the 2025-26 academic year. The student's assigned catalog year will remain in effect as long as the student maintains continuous enrollment. Changes to requirements as mandated by law or by rule of the District Board of Trustees may supersede this provision.

To maintain continuous enrollment, a student must have registration for, and successful completion of, at least one course within a three-term period. After three consecutive terms of no enrollment, the student will be discontinued from the current program of study and will need to apply to FSCJ to reenter under the same program of study. Upon readmission, the student will be assigned to the current catalog of record in the chosen program.

(2251) (A.S.) or Emergency Medical Technician (6394) (T.C.) or Fire Science Technology (2911) (A.S.). Terms Offered: Fall, Spring, Summer.
