

About the Program

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (B.S.N.) degree provides licensed registered nurses with the knowledge and skills required to become successful managers and leaders within public, private, and non-profit organizations. The fully online post-licensure BSN program allows you to earn a nursing degree from FSCJ while continuing to work.

This program requires a **minimum of 120 credit hours** including 60 transferrable college credit hours from the student's A.S.N. degree, which must be completed prior to applying to the program. Total program hours may vary based on the student's individual degree plan. This program **is eligible** for financial aid.

Program Requirements

B.S.N. program applicants must have earned an A.S.N. degree with at least 60 transferable college-credit hours from a regionally accredited institution. Students must fulfill all requirements outlined in the college catalog.

The following **prerequisite courses** must be completed prior to the first day of enrollment in the B.S.N. program: one *General Education Communication course, one General Education Humanities course, one General Education Mathematics course, four General Education Natural Sciences courses, and two General Education Social and Behavioral Sciences courses.

Students must also complete two additional *General Education Communication courses, one additional General Education Humanities course, STA 2023, one Civic Literacy course and HUN 1201 **prior to enrollment in Term 2 of Upper Division Coursework**.

Admissions to this program occur continually throughout the term. If you plan to use financial aid, applications must be received by the following priority deadlines to allow sufficient time for processing: Fall Term - June 1, Spring Term - October 1, Summer Term - February 1.
